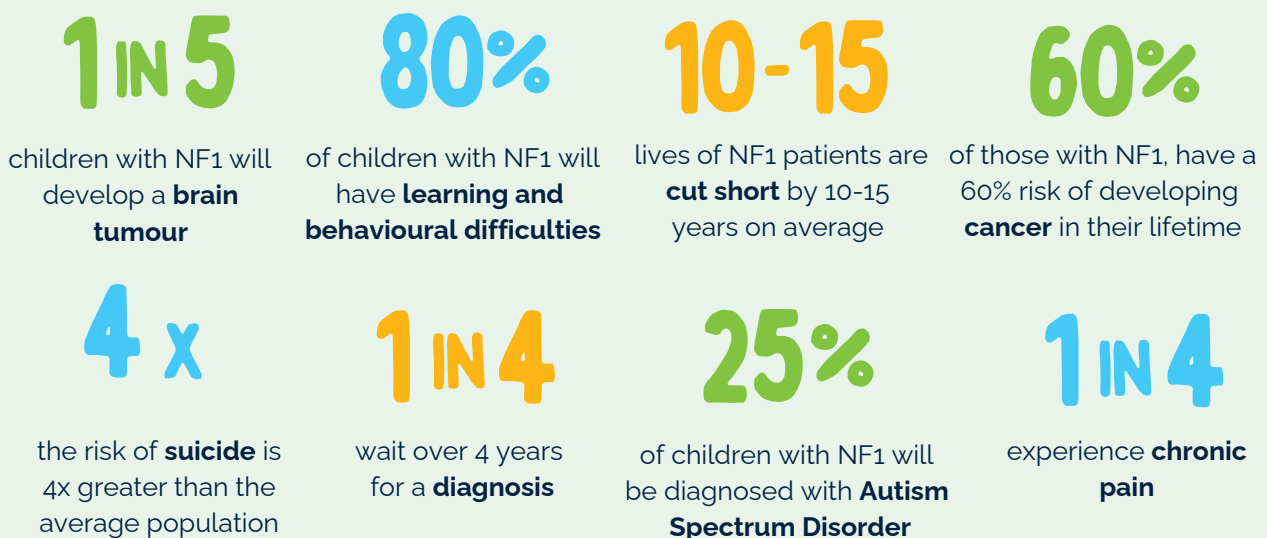
About NF

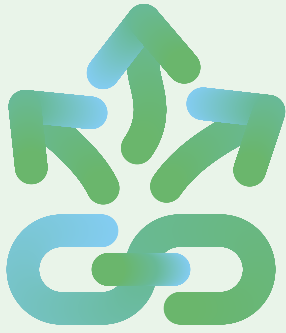
- Register at stepupfornf.com.au

- If you are the Team Captain, create a team name
- If you are a team member, find and select your team name
- Complete the registration process
- Save your team URL

- Share the event and tell them your team name.
- When they register for the event, they can select "Join team".
- If they have already registered, from their account area, they can select "Join Team".
- They can then find and select your team from the list, and join you in the fun!
